




St Stephen's Church School – Curriculum Forecast

Year 6, Term 1

These are the main areas of learning planned for the children this term. The book in the centre is the main text we will be using to inspire and enhance much of the learning.

Topic Title: The Promise – understanding the world around us

<p>Fiction: To write a narrative based on the story The Promise. To look in detail about how to create characters, describe settings and use dialogue with correct punctuation and grammar.</p> <p>Non-Fiction: To look at features of a biography and to write a chronological biography on an environmental scientist. To understand features of a speech and write one influenced by Greta Thunberg.</p> <p>Handwriting focus and recap Y3/4 spelling words.</p>	<p>Place Value: to recap numbers from 10,000- 1 million (Y5). Use numbers to 10 million, compare and order any number, round any number, negative numbers (Y6).</p> <p>Four Operations: to recap and extend addition knowledge in: subtraction, multiplication, and (short and long) division, including word problems. As well as learning about: factors, common factors, common multiples, primes to 100, squares and cubes.</p>
